INTRO TALLINN

Tallinn is very proud to hold the title of European Green Capital 2023. Especially since the idea of the European green capital was born in Tallinn.

The European Green Capital year gave Tallinn the opportunity to bring attention to environmental issues, test new green solutions in the city and launch new projects focusing on environment and inclusivity. The European Green Capital Year has helped to accelerate the green transition initiatives already underway and has laid the foundations for a number of new approaches. Pilot projects of various size and scale were implemented that accelerated the process of making Tallinn more sustainable.

The year opened the door to innovative green solutions such as interventions in urban spaces, replanting trees and establishing the criteria for environmentally friendly public events. The projects launched gave the city the opportunity to learn, experiment and discover sustainable solutions that work best and can be developed further.

Through innovation and fostering engagement, Tallinn is on its journey from a green capital to a green global capital.



BIODIVERSITY IS THE KEY: PRESERVING BIODIVERSITY AND INCREASING URBAN GREENERY

IMPLEMENTED ACTIONS, INITIATIVES AND PROJECTS:

Reducing the intensity of mowing on Tallinn green areas and parks in order to increase greenery in urban spaces. This principle will be continued incoming years.

More than 35 activities and clean-ups were carried out in the **Biodiversity action days** program through collaboration and engagement of citizens, which will continue in the coming year.

Two linear parks (Klindipark and Putukaväil) are being created in the coming years to support biodiversity. At Putukaväil or the **Pollinator Highway** the first communal garden of Tallinn **Pelguaed** will open next spring.

The development of the **Vormsi green area** (Go Green Routes project) will continue with the support of external funding, and there are also plans to increase the number of protected areas in the city. Several workshops and meetings were held in 2023, for example the VR Showcase of nature-based interventions in Tallinn's participation hub Avalinn.

Regional campaign **Save our Sea** brought together more than 156 000 people to care for their home sea, the Baltic Sea.

- In the Year of EGC, the building of Tallinn's first communal garden Pelguaed situated at the Pollinator Highway's North Tallinn part, was started.
- Procurement process for the first stage of Pollinator Highway has also been completed.
- The "Place Buzz" installations of Tallinn EGC 23 at the Pollinator Highway made it to the finals at the prestigious <u>New European Bauhaus</u> competition.
- An Smithsonian Gardens exhibition on biodiversity was opened with the US Embassy in Tallinn.

GoGreenRoutes

Several workshops and meetings were held in 2023, for example the VR Showcase of nature-based interventions in Tallinn's participation hub Avalinn. In May we presented the landscape architectural sketch of the **Vormsi green area** to the local community to analyze and get their feedback. At the end of the year, we prepared tenders for the design and construction of the Vormsi green area, and we are drifting forward to plan the start of construction activities this spring-summer.

GREY TO GREEN: INCREASING CLIMATE RESILIENCE THROUGH INNOVATION

The European Green Capital Year brought new green solutions to Tallinn, setting examples for other cities to follow.

One of Tallinn's strategic objective is to ensure the availability of environmentally friendly district heating solutions and the functioning of a vital service. To this end, the City of Tallinn set up a joint venture with Utilitas, Estonia's largest renewable energy Company, which will focus on the development of renewable energy solutions (using seawater and waste water) to ensure security of energy supply and stability in the price of heat for the citizens of Tallinn. It is also a step towards helping Tallinn move towards carbon neutrality.

For exploiting the potential of green innovation and strangthening collaboration with private sector, Tallinn launched the **Test in Tallinn program.**

While focusing on climate change as a priority topic, the Year of the Green Capital drew attention to sustainable **urban mobility development**.

New tram lines are under construction, with the first to be completed by summer 2024.


GREEN TRACKS PROJECT

European Green Capital pilot projects contributed to opening up and renewing urban spaces. For example, the Green Tracks project carried out a range of rapid interventions in urban space to test new solutions for planning public spaces.

The Green Tracks project aims to:

- Bring more greenery into the urban space and support the development of green networks
- Increase the quality of green areas
- Create better urban space in high-use areas
- Create some projects in every district

The projects helps to test which quick solutions for improving urban spaces work well, which don't, and where should the focus lie in the future.

FLAGSHIP TEST IN TALLINN

The Test in Tallinn program, initiated in the year of the European Green Capital, invites both Estonian and foreign companies to test their sustainable products and services suitable for a smart city in the capital.

Currently, **13 innovation projects** are underway, 7 of them from abroad.

Tallinn supports the testing of innovation projects in the urban environment on a case-by-case basis with a duration of up to 12 months.

OTHER FLAGSHIPS

MaaS (Mobility as a Service). Development has started for MaaS platform, which is adapted to Tallinn and will combine the various transport services offered in Tallinn into a single package.

Green Twins. The digital 3D-model is being **developed and tested** in various city departments, that shows how urban greenery changes over time and helps us understand how these changes affect the city's ecosystem.

TREASoURcE. Continuous development of systemic circular economy solutions for currently underutilised plastic waste, batteries and bio-waste.

DigiAudit. A digital platform with dashboards, performance analytic tools, and services is **tested** in total 45 municipal buildings.

SPINE (Smart public transport initiatives for climate-neutral European cities). 2023 has seen the creation of innovative simulation and Digital Twinning tools.





CITY FOR ALL: FOSTERING SUSTAINABILITY GOVERNANCE

The European Green Capital Year encouraged Tallinn to implement new solutions to be more sustainable. For example:

- The environmentally friendly criteria for public events. Tallinn was the first capital city in Europe to implement reusable solutions on such a large scale as the National Youth Song and Dance Festival (over 100 000 participants and visitors).
- With the disclosure of the OECD Circular Economy report this year, Tallinn received a boost to invest in the circular economy by upgrading its recycling facilities and repair workshops. Construction of the first circular economy centre has started, with a second center to be built in timber construction is planned for 2024.

The European Green Capital Year also provided more opportunities for citizen participation. Examples include:

- Citizen's engagement program "Let's create together", that supported 48 local projects in total amount of 1,2 miljon €
- Tallinn's first Citizens' Assembly
- Opening the co-creation space Tallinn's Participation HUB Avalinn
- Tallinn Green Ambassadors Initiative environmental activists, influencers, scientists, cultural figures,
- and entrepreneurs who, through their example, contribute to the implementation of more responsible and environmentally sustainable lifestyles and principles

FLAGSHIP SUSTAINABLE SONG AND DANCE FESTIVAL

As a result of the cooperation between Tallinn, the European Green Capital 2023, and Estonian Song-and Dance Festival Foundation the 13th Youth Song and Dance Festival was held in a significantly more environmentally friendly manner than before.

- 100,000 people were fed only with reusable dishes
- 3.5 tons less garbage
- 70 separate waste collection containers

FLAGSHIP GREEN CAPITAL CITIZENS' ASSEMBLY

The first Green Capital Citizen' Assembly took place from October 7 to November 4. With the help of experts and stakeholders, Tallinn invited citizens to discuss and answer the question: "How can we link Tallinn's green spaces into an inviting urban whole?"

Green Capital Citizen' Assembly had:

- 30 000 invitations
- 60 participants selected by geografical and socio-economical aspects to form a representative mini-Tallinn
- 39 proposals

The proposals of the Citizens' Assembly have been taken to the city government and ways will be found to turn them into real decisions and actions.

The proposals are being further processed by the Green Transition Office of the Tallinn Strategic Management Office.

KOPLI 93 MAKERSPACE AND COMMUNITY CENTRE

The aim of Kopli 93 Community Centre (Centrinno project) is to create an ecosystem of local stakeholders (schools, NGOs, makerspaces, artisans, businesses, activists) to boost the local productive and creative economic environment in order to make the neighbourhood more self-sufficient and resilient.

This year Kopli 93 started negotiations with existing and newly created makerspaces to map our needs and secure the future of Makerspaces in the network of circular economy centers.

In addition to the Kopli 93 Makerspace, the Centrinno project has launched several programs, and two of the most significant are "Living Archive", an archive of interviews and memories of community residents, and the "Cartography," which aims to map the network of local partners, businesses and resources to make community needs more easily met.

Other activities included Soil is Gold Week; traditional woodworking training series; workshop for making a mobile forge; successful garden season, community beehive development, regular workshops etc.





OTHER FLAGSHIPS

Sustainability Governance Framework. To achieve the transformation of our cities, we also need a transformative management system. We call this "Sustainability governance". It takes the SDG-s as the framework and proposes a system of processes and relationships that would help us build consensus, develop policies, and facilitate skills and enthusiasm to achieve our goals. In June 2023 we launched a

Patricipation HUB and co-planning app "AvaLinn (Open City). An exhibition and co-creation space was opened which is equipped with state-of-the-art visualisation technology, with the aim of facilitating citizens' participation in the urban design processes and fostering meaningful discussion between the city, developers, professionals and citizens.

NUDGING THE CITY ORGANISATION FROM WITHIN

Several new guidlines, rules and regulations were introduced and adopted within the city organisation itself this year:

- Guide to environmentally friendly events
 - Materials and purchases (necklaces, paper, decorations)
 - Catering and water use (avoidance of single-use plastics, food scraps, plant-based dishes)
 - Waste management (separate collection of waste)
 - Transport (accessibility by foot, bike and public transport)
 - Energy and resource efficiency (preferring renewable energy, energy efficiency)
 - Consideration of the surroundings and community (landscape, local residents, limiting noise and light pollution
- Green criteria in procurements
- Green office
- Sustainability governance framework
- Green factor
- Training program for city officials





LET'S CREATE TOGETHER FUNDING

48 projects received non-profit support from the green capital, in total of more than 1 million euros.

We supported:

- Additional environmental education programs of international events such as Tallinn Music Week, Black Night Film Festival and Robotex
- Urban space projects such as a community sauna, the mind garden of the Chamber of People with Disabilities, bucket gardens and insect hotel installations
- Various environmental education projects for youth, children, community and people with special needs

INTERNATIONAL PARTNERSHIPS

In collaboration with international partners, Tallinn hosted eight high-level conferences in 2023. Our partners included **influential organizations** such as the European Commission, OECD, Committee of the Regions, Covenant of Mayors for Climate and Energy, ICLEI, and Eurocities.

We have hosted a total of **19 foreign delegations** this year in Tallinn. Official delegations visiting the city showed genuine interest in the EGC 2023 programme, its focal points, and follow-up projects. These customized visits, which always received unique additions and developments based on the guests' preferences, were particularly cherished: Pollinator Highway, Kopli 93 centre, Ülemiste City, FinEst Centre for Smart Cities, Tehnopol, Utilitas Tallinn cogeneration plants, and others. Our guests gained a comprehensive overview of the city's strategic development directions and initiatives for the title year.

Tallinn's Green Capital year was showcased on the **international stage**. The Green Capital program, its flagship projects, initiatives, and ongoing legacy were strategically presented at selected events during the Cities and Regions Week, as well as the EU Open Day in Brussels, the Urban Future Forum in Stuttgart, and the UN Climate Conference COP28 in Dubai.

With all the international events, **tens of thousands of people** from around the world have been introduced with Tallinn's Green Capital initiatives.

In 2024, Tallinn is eagerly prepared to lead the **European Green Capitals Network**, which includes 36 cities.
